Time
 זמן

Place
 מקום

in Months, or a certain amount of time
 זמן מסוים שם חודש או בעוד

- e.g.
- See you **in** October.
 - The meeting is **in** a week.
 - She'll be arriving **in** a couple of weeks.
- But** - ■ She'll be arriving **in** next week.

Also,

- I like coffee **in the morning**.
 - He eats lunch **in the afternoon**.
 - We come home **in the evenings**.
 - Their plane lands **in the middle of** the night.
- But** - ■ I don't like to walk alone **at night**.
- Please don't be late, be there exactly **at noon**.

in A Country, State or city
 עיר שם ארץ, מדינה או

- e.g.
- I live **in** Israel.
 - My parents live **in** Connecticut.
 - There are a lot of museums **in** New York.

on Days, dates and holidays
 ימים, תאריכים וחגים

- e.g.
- See you **on** Monday.
 - Our meeting is **on** Wednesday.
 - Is the party **on** the 30th of December?
 - ≡ No, it's **on** the 31st - it's on New Year's Eve.

on A street
 שם רחוב

- e.g.
- My office is **on** Gordon Street.
 - The stores **on** Fifth Avenue are huge.
 - "They say the neon lights are bright **on** Broadway."

at A specific time
 שעה מסוימת

- e.g.
- See you **at** 4 o'clock.
 - The meeting is **at** 9am.

at A specific point or place
 מסוים נקודה או מקום

- e.g.
- The meeting is **at** the office.
 - Is he **at** home?
 - ≡ No, he's **at** the train-station already.
